For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them.

Matthew 18:20

BUMC Family and Friends,

The above quote from Jesus is a very well-known Bible verse. That's probably because of the inherent truth found within it. "Where two or three are gathered" in the name of Jesus, Jesus will be present with them as the Holy Spirit. This verse also highlights the importance of small groups within the faith. Jesus wants us gathered in small groups.

Gathering in larger groups for meals and to worship is wonderful, but it is in the small groups—where two or three are gathered in Jesus' name—that we really connect with each other and with God. Participating in small groups is an essential part of developing as a disciple of Christ and if you are not part of one, then you are missing out on a very important part of being a Christian.

Small groups do not have to be study groups either. Many are, but a small group can be a breakfast group, a book club, or can be formed around any common interest. In this season of our church when the Leadership Board is encouraging you to listen for and answer God's call in your life, consider the possibility that God is calling you to start a small group of some kind.

Our study groups are all led by clergy, so I would especially urge you to consider putting together some kind of study. You don't have to be a great theologian to do this either. There are plenty of books you could use as a guide. Remember that God speaks to all of us and so God would guide you and your potential small group in all that you do and discuss.

Please prayerfully consider forming a small group of some kind to help bring us closer together and closer to God. If you have any questions or would like any guidance, please contact me.



#### The tentative schedule for April is:


- April 5 Katie is rehearsing for the pageant.

Following Lent, he will begin a book study which is still being determined for the Thursday afternoon study and the Wednesday night study will pick a book of the bible that they're interested in studying.




### Rambling Roses

### Mission Trip: June 15-June 21

Our Youth Mission Team will be going to Augusta, Georgia the week of June 15 to help repair hurricane damaged homes. Augusta was hit hard this past year and there is a lot of need for assistance.
